

Testimony from the Estonian outreach TAPA 14

We were praying and we wrote our notes down. Then we went out on the streets with a group of four people. Just as we stepped out of the church garden, I saw a man with a walker in front of him. That helped him to walk. I had drawn this on my paper. I had also written „a yellow house“ and this man was just coming to a garden with a yellow house. Those were enough of a clue that we went to him. We told him what we were doing, and he allowed us to pray for him. Also, we invited him to the church service in the evening – and he came! He came the next evening too. So, he met Pastor Kivisild for the first time, and he will probably start visiting their services etc.

We saw a man with „a green t-shirt.“ That was one clue on a paper, and another member of our group added „under the tree.“ He was sitting under a tree in the park. A third member of our group had seen „a cap with an emblem on it“ – which we also had. So, we spoke with him and asked him if he had any „problems with his feet“ – because two of us had written that on our papers. He said that when he would lift heavy things that his knees would hurt. We prayed for his knees and also for his right shoulder that he said would hurt in the morning. This middle-age Estonian man was touched by this, and he had tears in his eyes. At the end I asked him what his name was because we had forgotten to ask him before that. He said it was Tomas. One member of our group was amazed because she had „Tom“ written on her paper!

We had a clue in the garden – it was „a tent.“ But we did not see any other clues – not even a person. Then, suddenly a man came outside, and as he was leaning on the fence, we saw a really big gold ring on his finger. The „ring“ was another clue! We had a chance to pray with him and talk about God's will for his life. We also had a longer discussion about God and churches. He was really open. We gave him a Bible and we continued to pray that God would speak to him through His Word.
